- a. A system of dots and dashes, or long and short sounds, developed by Samuel Morse. It can be listened to or read.
- b. To translate a code into an understandable message.
- c. The study of lip prints. Cheilo is Greek for lip.
- d. A message written in code.
- e. Soil that is mostly clay, a little sand and humus. Not good for growing.
- f. Dead plant or animal material that makes soil fertile.
- g. Going up and down.
- h. Soil that contains the right amounts of gravel, sand and clay. It also includes a great deal of humus, so it is good for growing. Usually dark brown or black.
- i. Soil that is mostly sand, a little clay and no humus. Not good for growing.
- j. A scientist who examines soil samples in a criminal investigation and determines their sources.
- k. To change a message into code.
- l. Evidence that tends to identify one particular person, such as fingerprints.
- m. Small amounts of evidence that could connect a suspect to the crime, like soil or glass.
