## Answer Sheet

**Aerophone:** An instrument that makes a sound by vibrating air which is usually inside of the instrument.

**Chordophone:** An instrument that makes a sound by vibrating strings.

**Ensemble:** A group of musicians all playing at the same time.

**Electrophone:** Changes the sound of an instrument through the use of a microphone and an amplifier.

**Idiophone:** An instrument that produces sound, by vibrating when the instrument itself is struck, without the use of strings or a membrane.

**Membranophone:** An instrument that produces sound by a vibrating membrane or skin.

**Percussion Instrument:** All instruments that may be played by shaking, rubbing or striking the instrument itself.

**Resonator:** A device to increase the intensity of sound by reechoing sound.

**Sachs-Hornbostel:** A four part musical classification system published by Curt Sachs and Erich von Hornbostel in 1914 and commonly used today.

**Vibrate:** To move rapidly back and forth.
